

Grants Officer Post.

An essential part of GRW's work is applying for grants from charitable trusts and other grant-making bodies. The grant officer post has been a real help to GRW and has the potential to be developed further.

The volunteer will need to be able to identify opportunities for grant-funding (in consultation with others) by matching the needs and aspirations of GRW with the aims of potential funders.

So far successful grant applications have focused on funders who can help with core costs. This has helped GRW achieve sustainability by helping meet essential expenditure like vets fees.

There is also scope to apply for project funding to develop particular aspects of GRW's work like providing more kennels at Hillcrest, or further enriching the environment for the dogs in our care, for example by creating a sensory area for them. These are all important aspects which help greyhounds find their forever home.

Requirements of the post

Training or mentoring would need to be provided to a suitable person who is keen to carry out the role but has limited or no previous experience of applying for grants. If you have no experience please let us know so that we can find out if anyone is available to mentor you.

The role requires:

- a self-starter who is able to work on their own initiative.
- good written communication skills and basic computer literacy

This role would be suitable for someone who would like to work in the Third Sector.

The work can be carried out flexibly and mainly from home, as long as deadlines for grant applications are met.
