

Greyhound Rescue Wales Homechecker.

This role involves assessing the suitability of would be adopters in their homes and matching a dog to them. This includes checking the home for safety and security of the hound and ensuring that the requirements of the hound are met. For adoption to work hounds the personality of individual adopters and dogs needs to match. For example, many hounds cannot be homed with other pets. There may also be young children to take into account. You will need to liaise with the homing team and log actions taken.

Requirements of the post

Training or mentoring will be provided to a suitable person who is keen to carry out the role.

The role requires:

- Access to a computer and basic computer literacy.
- Someone who is confident with people
- Some knowledge of sighthounds and their needs.

This role would be suitable for someone who would like to work in animal welfare.

The volunteer would be responsible to:

The area rehoming coordinator

How many hours would I be expected to work?

The work can be carried out flexibly and the number of hours worked are largely up to you, though most homecheckers do at least two hours a month. Some homecheckers do this around a full-time job. When a homecheck is required you will be asked if you are available. You can say 'no'.
